Dear Friends,

Welcome to you all I trust that you are well and being blessed, in the Lord, your family, your ministry and your work. I thank you all for your continued prayer and financial support of the work in Uganda and Discipleship Teaching.

Due to the Ugandan lockdown projects are still on hold at the moment. The Lockdown was due to end on the 2 August, unfortunately this has been extended for most, more information below.

UP DATE UGANDAN LOCKDOWN

The President of Uganda addressed the people on 30th July with an update on the Covid 19 situation. The reported daily infection rate had fallen from a average of 1700 per day to an average of 62 per day. Since the start of the pandemic in Uganda 600,000 have been hospitalised. Currently there are 62 cases in private hospitals and 500 in state hospitals. Below are the rules the people need to operate under.

1. Curfew time maintained
2. Bodada can move up 6pm (Motorbike Taxi)
3. Boda can carry one person
4. Kikuubo to open but all kiosks and road side vending banned.
5. Malls and arcades can open with compliance of sops.
6. Burials should not exceed 20
7. Weddings not more than 20
8. Places of worship to be closed and reviewed after 60 days
9. Out door sports allowed
10. Indoor sports allowed
11. Gaming closed
12. Bars remain closed
13. Restaurant open with Standard Operating Procedures (sops)
14. Saloons to operate with strict (sops)
15. Saunas to remain closed
16. Schools remain closed
17. Medical schools to open
18. Office workers 20%
19. Private vehicles to move across districts

My assessment of these rules are that the people are still being severely restricted in their ability to work. This will have a greater impact on the rural communities. Where in the greater part the source of income is subsistence farming. The consequence will be a deepening of the extreme poverty conditions they are already enduring.

We do not have any government information but there are many Ugandans dying from starvation. This is a direct consequence of the lockdown.

Now I am not knocking the Ugandan Government, they are having to make very difficult choices with limited resources. If you look at the Ugandan rates of Covid infection 1700 at its height compared to the UK 50,000 this policy has been successful.

The real challenge for Uganda and many other developing nations is the lack of infrastructure, particularly provision of medical services, free at the point of need.

It is disappointing that Schools and Churches are to remain closed for another 60 days.

UPDATE LUMPEWE PROJECT

Primary 7 students who sat the examinations to advance to secondary education all passed, 100% pass rate. We give thanks for all the hard work and dedication of the teachers who supported the students through this very difficult time.

Also to the students who applied themselves to their studies and achieved the following results

Grade 1— 2 students

Grade 2— 8 students

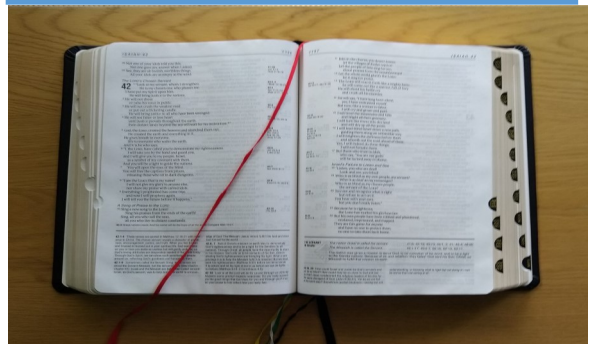
Grade 3— 5 students

His purpose of contacting me was to intercede for him, his family (several had contracted the Covid virus, pleased to announce that they are all now recovered) and the South Rwenzori Diocese where he is now the presiding Bishop. I feel very honoured that he should reach out to me and give thanks to our Lord Jesus.

Since then Bishop Nason invited me to participate in a Special Prayer Sunday for the South Rwenzori Diocese which was a privilege to do so.

Bishop Nason also requested that I include him on the distribution of the daily Discipleship Teachings. I look forward to strengthening our links with Bishop Nason and the South Rwenzori Diocese.
