Dear Friends,

Welcome to the fourth issue of our Newsletter. I would like to thank you for your continued financial and prayer support. In this edition we will focus on Food Parcels which our partners in Kampala, Lumpewe and South Rwenzori were able to distribute due to the funds provided by Derek Baldry Ministries. Each location received £100.00 to provide Food Parcels for those in most need.

FOOD PARCEL DISTRIBUTION

There was a total of 92 food parcels provided to the most needy. The local leaders were given the task of identifying those who would be the beneficiaries and what the food parcels would consist of. In South Rwenzori they fed 15 families with 6Kg of Beans and 10Kg of Maize Flour. Hope Centre Kampala gave out 27 food parcels consisting of 2kg Rice, 2Kg Maize Flour, 1Kg Sugar, 1Kg Beans and a bar of laundry soap. In Lumpewe they provided 50 parcels consisting of 2Kg Maize Flour, 1.5Kg Beans and half bar of laundry soap. With an average family size of 4 people means that approximately 360 people were provided with a desperately need supply of food.

This is good news, but there is a concern that due to the schools being closed for 2 years some of the older children might not return to school due to other social and economic pressure in families. Should this happen we could see another generation of children heading towards a life of poverty.

Headmaster Fredrick is currently working hard on plans to ensure that all staff and students will have a safe environment teach and learn when they return in January.
